She has worked with amateur sports, business and non-profit organizations over the years, and most recently with the firm of D-K Communications.

She holds a Master of Public Administration degree, a Certificate in Secondary Education/ English and a Bachelor of Science in English and Political Science. Gooding joins Anne C. Pease, Field Director for the Party, in the State Democratic Party's office.
